# Leeway Foundation announces its 2025 Media Artist + Activist Residencies

PHILADELPHIA, PA — Leeway Foundation is proud to announce the 2025 recipients of the Media Artist + Activist Residency (MAR), awarding \$125,000 in funding to five powerful collaborations between women, trans\*, and gender nonconforming media artists and social justice organizations across the Greater Philadelphia region.

Now in its fifth year, this residency supports deep-rooted, community-rooted residencies that document, amplify, and mobilize cultural and political movements through the transformative power of media and storytelling. This year's cohort of awardees share a focus on the importance of preservation and documentation as tools for liberatory practices addressing social issues impacting communities on local, state, and global levels. The proposed projects respond to a range of pressing concerns — from housing insecurity and immigrant justice to cultural erasure and divestment from systems of harm — while centering the leadership and lived experiences of Black, immigrant, trans, and LGBQ+ communities.

The 2025 residency projects span a wide range of media forms including documentary film, video projection, multimedia installations, and digital resource campaigns. Together, they spotlight Philadelphia as a site of visionary organizing and community-rooted care.

This year's awardees are:

<u>Aisha Mershani</u> will collaborate with <u>Amistad Law Project</u> to produce *In the Streets*, a public art and storytelling campaign, using wheatpaste photography and audio testimonies to draw powerful connections between resistance movements in Palestine and Philadelphia's fight for decarceration.

<u>angel shanel edwards</u> will partner with <u>Black Spatial Relics</u> to expand and document *Black I.O.N* (*It's Ours Now!*), a public performance and drama therapy program uplifting court-involved Black youth, by reclaiming city streets as spaces of joy and belonging through video vignettes and public projections.

<u>Bryheem "Broc" Hawkins</u> will work with <u>Ark of Safety</u>, Philadelphia's first trans-focused TLGBQ+ safe haven, to create a documentary and multimedia archive honoring the lives, brilliance, and resistance of unhoused queer and trans Philadelphians.

<u>Gabriela Watson-Burkett</u> will join forces with <u>Centro Integral de la Mujer Madre Tierra</u> to launch Empowering Madres Latinas, a multilingual media campaign centering immigrant mothers' stories and organizing power as a force for feminist immigrant justice.

<u>Melissa Beatriz</u> will collaborate with <u>People's Budget Office</u> on *Participatory Art and Budgeting*, a short film and digital resource campaign that demystifies Philadelphia's budget process and inspires everyday Philadelphians to engage in civic life through art and protest.

#### ABOUT THE MEDIA ARTIST + ACTIVIST RESIDENCY

The Media Artist + Activist Residency affirms the vital role of artists in social movements and builds bridges between cultural workers and social justice organizations. By resourcing these media-based collaborations, MAR supports projects that shift narratives, reclaim public space, and advance transformative justice.

Media Artist + Activist Residency applications are evaluated by an independent peer review panel. The 2025 review panel consisted of interdisciplinary artist and filmmaker, <a href="Hagudeza Rullán-Fantauzzi">Hagudeza Rullán-Fantauzzi</a> (LTA '24); multimedia artist and educator, <a href="Laura Deutch (MAR '24; ACG '10)">Laura Deutch (MAR '24; ACG '10)</a>; and social justice innovator and movement strategist, Makani Themba.
